News From The Royal Danish Embassy

Courtesy Meeting Between Indonesian Minister of Finance and Denmark Ambassador

During courtesy with the Indonesian Minister of Finance Sri Mulyani Indrawati, the Ambassador Lars Bo Larsen expressed Denmark continuous support to Indonesia Energy Transition Mechanism, which will be implemented in 2023 in a joint cooperation of Just Energy Transition Partnership (JETP), Denmark together with other International Partners Group (IPG) and Indonesia have committed to expedite power sector emissions reduction through RE expansion & connect it with financing.

The Ambassador and The Minister agreed that energy transition should be done in a credible & transparent manner.

Shared from the Danish experience in neighbouring country in succeeding the energy transition, the Ambassador underlined the importance of the increased green transition scale to create wider socio economic benefit e.g job creation and competitive RE prices. Recognizing the gap, under the Indonesian government leads within the 6 months the JETP secretariat will be formed and with the consolidated inputs from IPG and the overall policy reform it would helpful in addressing numerous challenges in the transition.

The Minister Sri Mulyani also emphasized the needs of significant role of PT Pertamina (Persero) and PT PLN (Persero) as the state owned enterprise in energy sector, and both should be prepared fundamentally and financially in working towards the transformation.

The Ambassador also introduced the blended finance mechanism with Danish Investor as one of strategy to support the PLN to improve its financial performance. The Minister explained, Indonesia have implemented this blended finance scheme in the infrastructure projects with the private sector participation as the Indonesian government strategy in to maximizing the state budget performance. The similar blended finance concept will also be adopted in the ETM with PT Sarana Multi Infrastruktur (Persero) as the Ministry of Finance special mission vehicle and support from the Indonesia Investment Authority (INA) for the sovereign wealth fund.

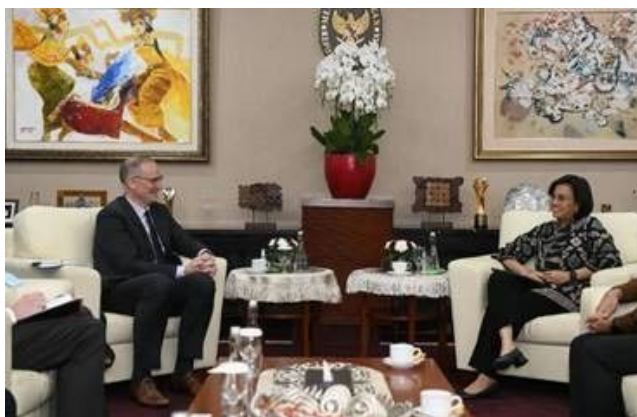
